

CONDITIONS

1. Fences will be numbered separately for each class. Competitors will be eliminated if the wrong fence is jumped. The judge's decision is final.
2. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organiser or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organiser of any event to which these rules apply, nor British Eventing, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horse, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.
3. The organiser has the right to cancel any class or event; to divide any class, to alter the course if necessary and to refuse any entry.
4. The organiser of this event has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organiser and all officials and stewards.
5. Any objections must be made to the secretary, in writing, and accompanied by a deposit of £10 which is returnable if the objection is sustained.
6. All dogs must be kept on leads at all times.
7. In the event of cancellation, refunds will be made after deduction of expenses.
8. Jackets, sweater or cross-country colours may be worn.
9. Crash hats with chin straps secured, or hard hats, to be worn at all times when mounted. It is recommended that effective body protection be worn.

EVENTER TRIALS RULES

Rules for all classes are identical. The competition is designed to encourage horses/ponies to jump a show jumping course and then a cross-country course. A competitor will be started at the entrance to the show jumping ring and will start the show jumping course IMMEDIATELY and will, on completion, proceed IMMEDIATELY to the cross-country course.

There is no overall timing but, in the event of equality of penalties, the winner will be the rider with the lowest number of penalties combined with the nearest to the optimum time through the timed section of the cross-country course.

TWO REFUSALS ONLY allowed at any one fence after which a competitor MUST continue to the next fence. A THIRD ATTEMPT or by-passing without attempting a fence will incur ELIMINATION AND THE COMPETITOR MUST LEAVE THE COURSE.

SCORING: 10 penalties for each refusal, knockdown or fall of rider or horse/pony in the show jumping. 20 penalties for the first refusal, 40 penalties for the second refusal and 65 penalties for a fall of rider at an obstacle.

Open to members of the Dunston Harriers, Dunston Hunt Club, South Norfolk and Thetford Chase Pony Clubs on proof of membership. Entry fee: £8.
